Rules Regarding Admission

The admission of this programme opens generally with other bachelor degree programmes of the Tribhuvan University. Applicants seeking admission, except foreigners, should face entrance exam. Entrance exam is conducted by the office of the Dean, Faculty of Law, TU. Students seeking admission shall have to apply within the stipulated time as prescribed by the Faculty of Law.

Nepal Law Campus shall admit seventy students on the basis of merit list of Faculty of Law. Those students who are in the merit list of the Faculty and seeking admission in the Nepal Law Campus shall have to apply in Campus within stipulated time as prescribed by Campus. There shall be two sections and 35 students shall remain in each section. Out of 70 seats, twenty two seats are reserved for vulnerable and minority groups and for foreigners only for admission purpose. Nepal Law Campus does not exempt admission fee or tuition fees or any types of fees, and it does not provide any privilege to those students who are eligible for getting admission in such reserved seats.

The seat allocation for admission purose is as follows:

- Woman - 4
- Indigenous/Janjati - 4
- Madheshi - 4
- Dalit - 2
- Person with disability - 2
- Backward Area - 2
- Foreigner - 4

Important Rules of Entrance Exam

1. General Rules of examinations shall be required to be followed.
2. Examinees are required to use **black-ink** only.
3. The medium of examination shall be either English or Nepali
4. Any type of unwanted symbol, mark, sign and statements is strictly prohibited in answer sheet.
5. **Answer sheet shall not be examined** in case of failure to comply with any of the above instructions.

Nepal Law Campus (NLC)

Nepal Law Campus is the oldest college imparting legal education in Nepal. NLC witnessed many ups and downs in legal education system. As a constituent campus of Tribhuvan University and as the oldest institution imparting legal education, NLC has the great contribution in Legal Education. NLC is proud of providing highest and competent leadership for judiciary and other mechanism within the country and abroad.

Legal Education in Nepal

Traditional legal education system which was imparted by *Shrestha Patshala* was not sufficient to meet the needs of the time. The political changes of 1950 caused restructuring in every field of social sector. Consequently, Nepal Law College (present NLC) was established in 1954 to produce necessary human resource for the country in legal sector. In the year 1971, National Education System Plan was implemented with the objectives of producing necessary, competent human resources of different levels in different areas to meet the country's needs to achieve its development goals. It significantly made a great breakthrough in the legal education system as well in the country by incorporating Nepalese laws in the courses of study. In 1972, the Institute of Law prepared 2 years comprehensive curriculum for Certificate Level (CL) and 3 years curriculum for Diploma in Law (D.L.).

In the year 1980-1986, Tribhuvan University underwent a massive restructuring. Consequently, the Institute of Law renamed as the Faculty of Law was empowered to frame and coordinate academic activities concerning legal education. Consequently, 2 years Certificate Level (CL) and 3 years Diploma in Law were renamed as Proficiency Certificate in law (PCL) and Bachelor's Degree in Law (B.L.) respectively.

In 1996, Tribhuvan University, Faculty of Law introduced after graduation three years Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) programme. The Proficiency Certificate in Law was phased out and 3 years Bachelor's Degree in Law (B.L.) was replaced by Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.). Currently NLC is also running two years Master of Laws (LL.M.) programme since 1996.

In the changed context Tribhuvan University, Faculty of Law completely revised existing curriculum of three years LL.B. and two years LL. M. in 2009. In addition to these programmes, a three year LL.M. programme has also been introduced from 2012.

B.A.LL.B. Programme

In order to make legal education compatible with changed national and international context, Tribhuvan University, Faculty of Law has introduced new five years B.A.LL.B. courses from 2010. The course basically aims to enrich law students with comprehensive theoretical and practical knowledge in indigenous as well as foreign legal traditions, lawyering skills, and research to meet the challenges of the age.

Objectives of the program

The main objectives of this programme are:

- to produce human resource equipped with necessary skill, competency and integrity
- to impart sense of responsibility towards society, nation and the world.
- to produce human resources for respecting human life and values
- to develop a base of legal excellence with international and indigenous understanding;
- to promote research and understand insights of law and society,
- to prepare competent human resource in the field of law and justice;
- to inculcate legal knowledge from socio-cultural and developmental perspective,

Career Opportunities:

After completion of this course student may develop their career as jurist, judge, lawyer, law teacher, researcher, legal adviser, counsellor, ADR expert, judicial and civil service, social and development activist, human right defender and so on.

Duration:

B.A.LL.B. is a complete and full time five years course. Students must be dedicated & be regular in whole five years course and must be presented in each class. Classes will be conducted in day time. A teaching period is of 1 hour for each subject. The number of classes shall be of 4 hours for 100 marks and 2 hours for 50 marks subjects per week.

Teaching Methods:

Teaching strategies consist of lecture, case study, discussion, question-answer, problem solving, research, seminar, workshop, tutorial and self-study. The important feature of teaching include interdisciplinary approaches, participatory and instructional materials include white board, note books, teaching guides, case materials etc. The teaching/learning method will also be based on electronic devices.

Visiting Faculties:

NLC may invite eminent professors, experts, legal personalities of Nepal and from abroad as visiting faculties.

Eligibility for Admission:

Candidates who have completed Higher Secondary Level Education (10+2), PCL or equivalent level are eligible to appear in entrance examination. A candidate passing the entrance exam shall be eligible for admission only on the basis of marks obtained in entrance. The full marks of entrance exam is 100.

Contents for Entrance Test:

1. Introduction to Law and kinds of Law.
2. Importance and role of Law in a Society.
3. Source of Law
4. General Introduction to Rights and Duties.
5. Person: Kinds of Person (Legal and Natural).
6. General Introduction to Constitution.
7. Fundamental Rights under the Constitution of Nepal.

Required Testimonials:

Applicant should submit the copies of:

- Certificate and mark-sheet/transcript of (10+2) or PCL or equivalent
- Character Certificate,
- Migration Certificate (if applicable),
- Citizenship Certificate,
- Other required documents

Attendance:

Students are required to attend all the theoretical and practical classes. She/he must be presented minimum 80% of classes and fulfill other requirements in order to be eligible to appear in the final examinations.

Final Evaluation and Examination

Internal and external evaluation in respective subject shall be carried out. There shall be written examination at the end of each academic year except for Clinical law, Seminar, Moot Court and thesis writing. No student shall be allowed to proceed from the first years to the second years unless she/he passes at least one subject in the first year examination. No student shall be allowed to appear in the final examination unless she/he meets attendance and presents necessary term papers in each subject. Minimum requirement for passing the annual exam is 45 percent. The degree will be graded as follows:

75% and above	: Distinction
60% to below 75 %	: First Division
45 % to below 60 %	: Second Division

Library:

NLC has its own well furnished and well equipped library with text books, reference books, Law Journals, Gazettes and Nepal Law Reports. Besides, students can visit Central Library T.U. Kirtipur, Central Law Library Jamal, Supreme Court Library, Nepal Bar Association Library, Library of Office of the Attorney General of Nepal and Nepal Bar Council Library and Library of Ministry of Law. Students can take additional benefits from American Information Center and SAARC Library.

Computer Lab:

NLC has well equipped computer lab with internet facility.

Sports:

Indoor and outdoor games would be offered for the students.

Uniform:

Student should be dressed on cream colour shirt, black suit, maroon colour tie with NLC logo and black leather shoes. Seasonal modification could be made with consent of authority.

Medical Facility:

NLC has its own dispensary for the primary health services. Every student shall be provided the primary health service if required.

Classroom:

NLC has well furnished classrooms. It has also a separate Moot Court room and a seminar hall.
